

The Fourth Moon and Looks Far Woman

In the spirit of attentive presence and entertaining the possibility of alternate realities, tonight is the new moon, the one night all month when the sun's light is not reflected from the moon's surface. The new moon is a ripe time for planting seeds of any kind. It's a threshold night, a pause between last night's waning and tomorrow's waxing moon. Just as the moon waxes and wanes, so do we. Sometimes we are filled with light and we reflect that light to others. Sometimes, our darkness is more visible and we might rely on others to shine their light on us. It's an auspicious time to be right in that in-between during this weekend of thresholds.

In some Native American traditions, tonight is the start of the fourth moon cycle of the year, which is looked over by Looks Far Woman. She is one of the original Thirteen Clan Mothers and gives us the medicine of knowing how to See The Truth around us. When she first came to Earth, Looks Far Woman became the Guardian of the Dreamtime, also known as the Crack in the Universe, and the Keeper of Inner Potential for all of us. She is the Mother of visions, dreams, and psychic impressions. She helps us discover and use our own unique gifts for the good of humanity. We all have the seeds of prophecy planted inside us, the ability to see past, future, and all probabilities when we are fully present.

Looks Far Woman is always ready to work with those who have the eyes to see, the ears to listen, and the heart to understand. This inner knowing serves us well, when we release the need to control any outcome of what we create.
